

Summer safety and security

Summer brings many people to Indianola. Most are appreciative and respectful in their use of Indianola properties. However in past summers, there have been issues with unsafe beach fires, underage drinking, excessive noise, illegal fireworks, vandalism and drug activity. The IBIC is responsible for the maintenance and care of its properties: Rose Marie's Park to the right of the dock stairs, the tidelands between Division and Kitsap streets, 6 beach accesses, the boat ramp at Western Ave, the Gill property, the Clubhouse and Pavilion. The Dock is the responsibility of the Indianola Port Authority.

This year, IBIC has approved a more limited security budget. The Board has chosen to employ Safe Security officers and off duty Kitsap County Sheriffs for limited patrols. But in addition, each one of us needs to be eyes and ears to any unsafe activity...kind of like a Neighborhood Watch for the beach. If a few words can resolve these activities, great, then have a conversation. Most issues can be solved in this way. Our goal should be to educate users about good beach behavior. However, if there is illegal activity, please call 911. When reporting, you may choose to identify yourself or remain anonymous. Let's be vigilant and take care of this wonderful community.

For clarification:

911 Calls: go to Central Dispatch, then to both KC Sheriff and Suquamish Police. They are prioritized: emergent, 15 min. non emergent, 1/2 to 4 hours. There are only 2 deputies on duty in North Kitsap and limited Suquamish Police. Both law enforcement agencies are aware of the increased activity in Indianola during the summer and have agreed, as able, to increase routine patrols.

Fireworks: Legally allowed ONLY on the 4th of July between 1100am and 11pm. M80s, M100's and cherry bombs are illegal. Yes, Indianola is within the Port Madison Indian Reservation, but this is county law. Violators are open for citations and arrest. Beach fires: per Kitsap Fire District: no more than 3 feet by 3 feet with height no greater than 2 feet. must be 25 feet from stationary driftwood or a structure. cannot be unattended. not allowed to use beachwood/bring our own wood. All fires must be put out completely. Have a 5 gallon bucket and a shovel available.

Private beaches: except for specific areas, Indianola beaches are privately owned. Each beachfront property owner's land extends down to the ordinary high tide line and includes the tidelands outside those owned by the IBIC. Fine for walking, but not OK for beach picnics/fires unless you have permission from the owner. A property owner is within their rights to call 911 if someone does not leave when asked. IBIC properties are for the use of Indianola residents and their guests. The Indianola Waterfront Preserve (no fires, no alcohol) is a public beach.

Indianola Dock: the Dock is managed by the Port of Indianola. The tidelands below the dock and 50 feet on either side are Port property. Dock rules are posted. The Port Commissioners are John Lane, Jeff Henderson and Eric Cookson.

Minutes April and May Meetings: MSP'd

Treasurer's Report: presented for audit. There has been \$3600 in donations designated for the kitchen project.

Public Comments:

Lyn Grinstein read a letter from one of her neighbors, John Roberts, regarding problems relating to the boat ramp and partying going on with much trash being left behind. Neighbors are concerned with the increased activity over the last few years, especially at the 4th of July parties and the danger of fireworks.

Committee Reports

Chair: Nancy thanked County Clerk Dave Petersen for volunteering his time to lead training in Roberts Rules of Order for the Board and interested community members. It was a great review and because of that we have implemented some changes to the meeting structure. We will start and end each meeting with 10 minutes for membership input. We will follow Roberts Rules in governing meetings.

Membership: 842 voting members

Merchandise: Gross sales are \$4776 and expenses are \$5802 because of new merchandise.

Properties: MSP'd unanimous vote \$500 for rock barriers to protect post office from moving vehicles. Work will be done by Travis Moore. Thank you. Maple tree on corner by PO will get trimmed in June. The Kinnairds trimmed vegetation from beach access. Thank you. CH doors are getting changed out to meet Fire Code Regulations.

Security: MSP'd to split the security budget not to exceed \$3000 between off duty police and Safe Security. Lisa Fitch voted Nay.

Boat Ramp: Pat Hatchel and Bridget Young will present a proposal for action on the boat ramp at the next meeting.

Conflict of Interest: Board was reminded to turn in signed conflict of interest forms to the Secretary.

Website: MSP'd to appoint the website committee of Robert Jones, Emily Reckord and Catherine Kolb Freeman to select a designer from the submitted proposals and to commit to a contract for up to \$2000 for the website.

Swim Float: The committee is disbanded as volunteers are doing the work to refurbish the float.

Facebook: Only Indianola Events will be posted on the Facebook page.

Insurance: MSP'd to keep our liability insurance coverage the same.

Public Comments:

Colleen Vlahovich addressed the use of Safe Security with others also commenting on their guards not doing their job properly. Colleen has also seen the security guards being harassed by beach goers.

Events: Indianola Days are August 8-10, 2014, Annual Meeting is August 24th at 4 PM.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:30 PM.



PORT COMMISSIONERS DOCK UPDATE

Your Port Commissioners are very happy to announce the dock will be open this summer.

Last November Bill Sibbett donated logs, Paul Smythe donated milling, Art Langlie and Jeff Kanyer donated safety equipment and tools, and dozens donated their time to install cross bracing, shims and brackets. The Commissioners thank all participants for their commitment to ensuring a safe structure for all to enjoy.

Moving forward, the Port secured four bids from reputable firms to replace a series of structural piling. Quigg Brothers, an Aberdeen WA firm, was selected based on availability, flexibility, price and reputation.

Permits for Kitsap County, The Army Corps of Engineers and DFW are complete and submitted. Each agency has their own timelines, fees and requirements. A super special thank you to Lisa Fitch, Connie Reckord and Paul Larson for their hard work and dedication in preparing and submitting these daunting applications.

What is happening now? Ten bents (a piling system comprised of the pile cap and piles) will be removed and replaced. The replacement pilings will be 12" galvanized steel and the wood pile caps will be replaced with galvanized steel 'I Beams'. The beauty of this system is we are removing a total of thirty four pilings and replacing only twenty. The new structure meets or exceeds all engineering requirements.

When will it happen? It is anticipated that Quigg Brothers will start this September, the target month, pending receipt of applicable permits. The dock will be closed for a short time during construction. The closure is important to ensure the safety of the workers and all who would normally use it.

What's next? The Port Advisory Board and Commissioners are looking to put together a timeline to continue replacement of the substructure.

The commissioners welcome all suggestions. We have so much varied expertise in Indianola we would be remiss to not listen.

JOHN R. JACOBSEN
1935-2014

Captain John Reinholdt Jacobsen (USN Retired) passed away April 11th 2014, surrounded by his family. John was born in Elizabeth, NJ March 15th, 1935 to Borge and Sylvia Jacobsen. The second of four children, the family who had just immigrated to the US in 1930, returned to Denmark just prior to the German occupation. After the war, they returned to the US where John graduated high school in Summit NJ. He earned a mechanical engineering degree from Stevens Institute of Technology and was commissioned into the US Navy's Civil Engineer Corps in 1959; later earning his Master's in Management from the Naval Post Graduate School in Monterey, CA.

In 1974 John received orders to Bangor. While searching for a home for his family, he drove toward Kingston looking for Shamrock Realty. He missed the turn and ended up on the Indianola Road. It was one of those clear Fall days when the water just sparkles around the dock like diamonds. Old Charlie Brickell came out to chat with John and let him know that the house on the corner of Beach and Shore had just come up for sale. He immediately got back into the car and headed to Kingston to buy that house. Getting lost and winding up in Indianola was truly one of the best things that could have happened.

After retiring from the Navy in 1983, John soon found himself with too much time and not enough projects so he took a position with the Seattle School District as the Project Manager for the next 11 years. In 1991 he took on the position as an Indianola Port Commissioner, a volunteer position that he dedicated many hours to for 21 years. He was involved with IBIC for many years serving in many capacities. He was one of those rare breeds of people who give selflessly of their time without seeking any accolades.

John enjoyed boating with his family and friends. His years of involvement with the Classic Yacht Club and caring for the "Lady Grace" were some of his best times. John also loved to ski; especially where others had not. Finding fresh powder was always the goal. But the best part of skiing for John was the company he was with; again, family and friends.
