

INSTRUCTIONS FOR PLACEMENT OF HULL PERMIT

Please follow these instructions for placement and application of the Boat Storage Permit sticker and personal identification information.

FOR KAYAKS AND CANOES:

With your boat right-side-up, apply the Boat Storage Permit sticker right-side-up on the LEFT front side (bow) of the hull toward the top as pictured below.

Note: For kayakers, this position may be underwater during use but this is acceptable.

Try to keep the permit sticker off of maker labels and handwritten information.



FOR BOATS:

Because boats are usually placed on the boat rack bow first (stern out), with your boat right-side-up, apply the Boat Storage Permit sticker right-side-up on the back end (stern) of the boat toward the top in the position pictured below.



If you want to place your boat on the rack stern first (bow out), place the permit sticker on the bow (like the kayaks and canoes.)

Also, please ID your boat with your first initial, last name and phone number on same end of boat. Write on hull or attach with zip tie.

The primary goal of locating the permit sticker in these areas is for it to be uniformly visible when stored on the boat rack. Don't try to remove the sticker. It will not come off in one piece.

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS

Before applying your labels, follow these guidelines to ensure the best adhesion:

Clean the surface with alcohol or solvent* prior to application to ensure the surface is not contaminated. Injection molded and machined parts often have oil residue contaminates. Do not clean with soapy water or cleaners that leave residue. Oils from your hands can contaminate the adhesive on the label. ***Test solvents in an inconspicuous area before use.**

Use firm pressure when applying label to increase adhesive contact to the application surface. The adhesive is activated with pressure. To prevent air bubbles under the label, press down one edge of the label and move across the label applying firm pressure.

Warm temperatures will make the adhesive more pliable, and will increase surface contact when applying to textured surfaces. Adhesive cures quicker in warm environments. When extremely cold, the adhesive will have less initial tack and will take longer to cure. Manufacturer recommends the label and application surface to be between 70-90° F for optimal adhesion.

Give adhesive time to cure after applying. The pressure of applying the label begins a curing process. The adhesive will fully cure 1-2 weeks after the initial application.
